GST mop-up in May rises 12% y-o-y on robust demand

Strong demand in the economy and better compliance helped collection from Goods & Services Tax (GST) reach ₹1.57-lakh crore in May. Though 12 per cent higher than last May, sequentially the mop-up was down 16 per cent over April. Experts expect the collection to rise in the coming months.

In a statement, the Finance Ministry said the monthly GST revenue stands at over ₹1.4-lakh crore for the 14th consecutive month. Revenue from import of goods was 12 per cent higher than in May 2022, and that from domestic transactions (including import of services) was up 11 per cent.

GOOD COMPLIANCE

Commenting on the number, MS Mani, Partner with Deloitte India, said while the collection in absolute terms is lower than in April — which had an embedded year-end impact — it reflects a continuation of the good economic performance across States witnessed since last year.

Now, all eyes are on the impact of the special drive against fake assessees. Vivek Jalan, Partner with Tax Connect Advisory, expects that with the clean-up drive kick-
