

Global meet ends with promise of ₹5.75 lakh crore investments

FOCUS AREAS. Energy sector dominates MoUs, followed by data centres, pharma and entertainment

The Telangana government has attracted investments to the tune of ₹5.75 lakh crore during the two-day Telangana Rising Global Summit, which concluded here on Tuesday.

Nearly half of the investments are in the energy sector, followed by data centres, pharma and entertainment.

On the second day of the meet, Infrakey Datacenter Parks signed a deal with the State government to set up a 1 GW AI data centre at an investment of ₹70,000 crore. Singapore-based AGIDC committed to invest ₹67,500 crore to set up a major (international gateway) data centre.

"JCK Infra Projects Ltd signed an agreement with us to invest ₹9,000 crore toward developing an integrated AI city and township in Bharat Future City," a senior government official said. At the valedictory ceremony, Chief Minister A Revanth

Reddy launched the Telangana Rising 2047 Vision Document, which outlines strategies to achieve a \$1-trillion economy by 2034, and \$3-trillion economy by 2047.

NITI Aayog and Indian School of Business (ISB) have prepared the document. "Prime Minister Narendra Modi has set a target to take the country's economy to \$30 trillion by 2047. We would like to achieve 10 per cent of that. We are currently contributing 5 per cent . to the country's economy," the Chief Minister said. Dedicating the policy document to the people, he said it addresses the needs of farmers, women and youth.

"I came from a humble background. And I have a responsibility to address the challenges. I have taken in-
