Electric vehicles are poised to dominate the showcase at Bharat Mandapam, the main venue. Leading automakers are set to unveil a plethora of EV models, signalling a strong shift toward green mobility. Maruti Suzuki, the country's largest passengervehicle manufacturer, will launch its first electric SUV, the eVI-TARA. Hyundai Motor India will debut its Creta EV on the inaugural

day, further intensifying the EV race.

In the luxury segment, Mercedes-Benz will dazzle attendees with the global debut of its electric EQS Maybach SUV and showcase its futuristic electric concept CLA and G Electric SUV.Meanwhile,BMW will unveil the all-electric BMW i7 alongside the -launch of its new BMW X3, underscoring its commitment to electric innovation.

In total, more than 40 new prod-

uct lenches are expected in the auto mot segment alone, making EVs the chaterpiece of this year's expo.

The Bharat Mobility Global Expo 202 will bring together a wide array of stateholders, from vehicle manufacturers to component makers, energy storage solution providers, and software innovators. Supported by the ministry of commerce &

industry, the event is hosted by leading industry associations, including the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers

(Siam), Automotivé Component Manu-

facturers Association of India (Acma), and the India Energy Storage Alliance (IESA), among others.
